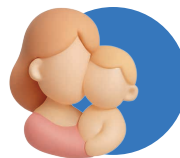

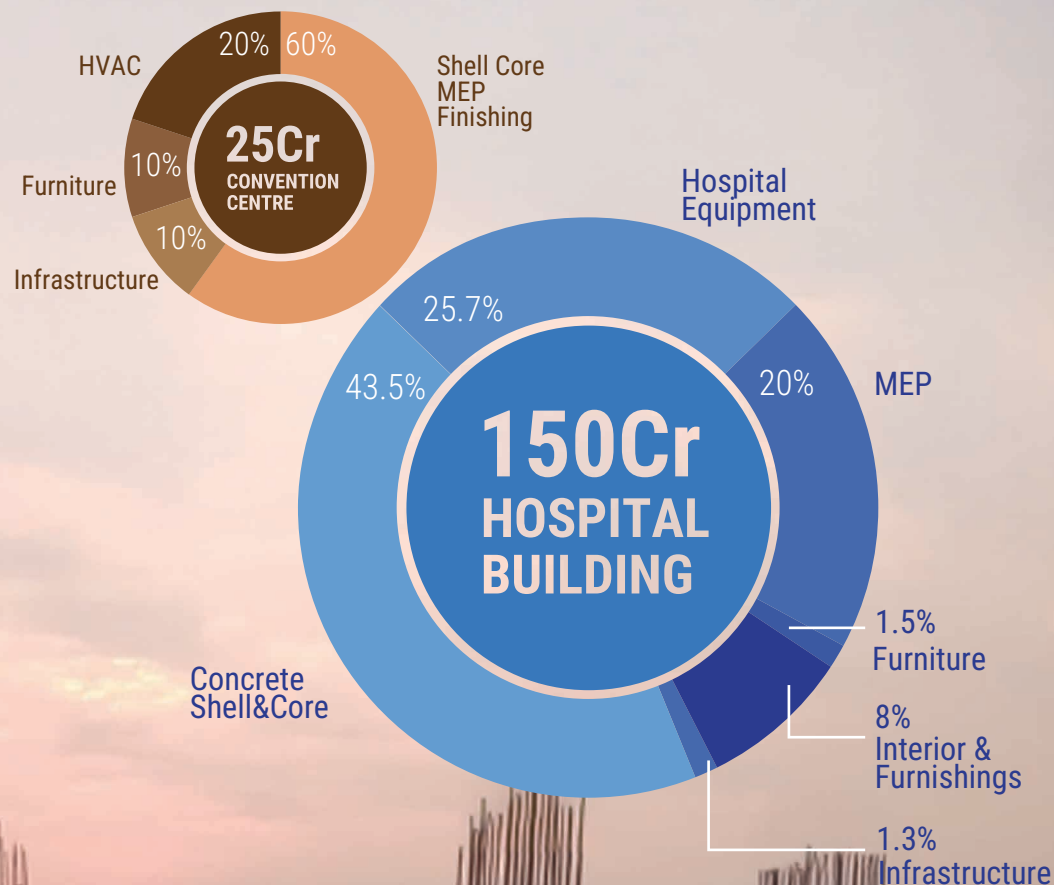

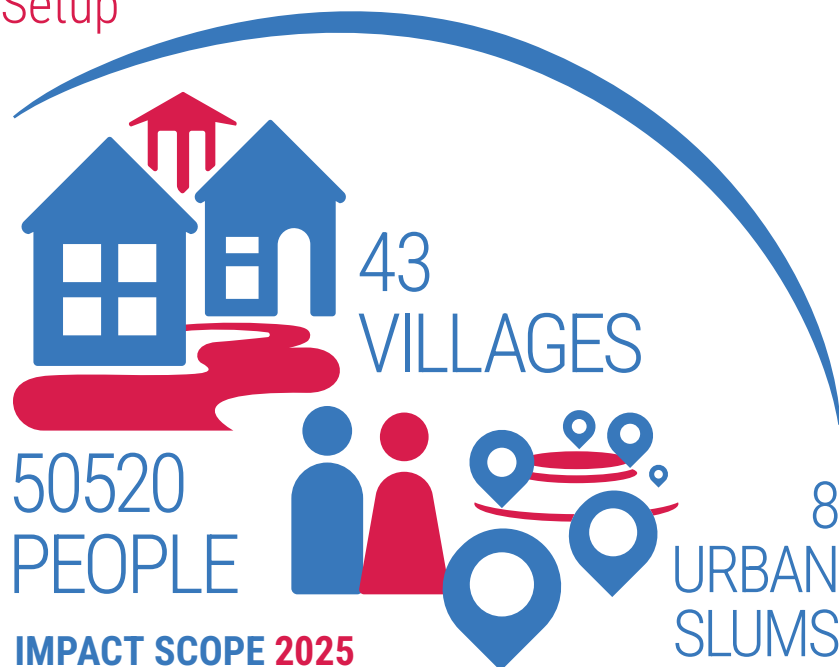

Other than our regular OPDs and the steady delivery of our ongoing services, this year has been about moving with purpose toward our larger vision. The Samvedana Outreach Initiative, born from a belief that every person deserves healthcare at their doorstep, has now shifted to screening and door-to-door health surveys, expanding to reach 43 villages and 8 urban slums, building on the 17 locations we began with and the 28+ that are now active.



We have begun knitting together weekly OPDs, maternal health tracking, anemia care, school health programs, and the work of village health volunteers into a connected, living system. Detailed surveys have revealed truths that demand action: undiagnosed hypertension, the persistent weight of anemia, and the hidden harm from pesticide use.

While the full network is still taking shape, the momentum is real. This year has been about maintaining our care while building, step by step, the system that will sustain it for years to come.



In 2025, Samvedana focused on foundational groundwork by conducting an intensive series of community health surveys across rural Amravati. This year was dedicated to building an evidence base capturing the real burden of non-communicable diseases, nutritional anemia, pesticide-related health hazards, and maternal&child health gaps across the project span

Rather than just offering services, this year's work was about listening to the data, identifying silent crises, and mapping communities with precision. The insights generated form the backbone of Samvedana's upcoming action plans ensuring future interventions are evidence-based, targeted, and outcome-oriented towards nation stronger at its core.



Over 879 individuals were screened in a focused NCD cluster 'A' of Timtala village alone, revealing alarming trends such as undiagnosed hypertension, high-risk lifestyles, and lack of preventive diagnostics. The anemia surveys exposed a widespread but under-addressed challenge among women of reproductive age.

At our hospital, we believe that hope is never negotiable. No matter the hour, the urgency, or the complexity, we stand committed to engaging with every patient and every need. We do not turn away from a challenge; instead we step forward, ready to deliver essential care with compassion and determination. Here, the state of a patient's health is never a reason to lose faith. It is a call to act. Our team works tirelessly to ensure that no life is left without support and no hope is left unanswered.



From Faith Shaken to Faith Restored

A pilgrimage to Mahakumbh turned tragic when Mrs. Radha Bhanushali suffered a severe tibia fracture, her leg shattered into pieces. Far from home and fearing she would never walk again, she traveled 900 km to Hedgewar Hospital. Many would hesitate but we don't say no. Dr. Abhilash Pohokar operated the same day and by morning her pain was gone. Within a month she walked unaided, her faith restored and proving that skill and commitment can turn despair into joy.

An Almost Impossible Recovery

A 35 year-old Rajiv Lale man from rural Yavatmal had Stage 5 chronic kidney disease with creatinine 8.5 and dangerously high BP. Survival needed urgent dialysis and transplant. We don't say no when cases seem impossible. Our team stabilised him, guided his family through complex steps and referred him for transplant. His mother became the donor and the surgery succeeded. Today both are healthy, a testament to timely diagnosis, teamwork and willpower.



A Midnight Fight for Life

At 2 am a young mother Sushila Bhagat from Melghat arrived in septic shock with kidneys failing, lungs in distress and BP collapsing, along with a breast abscess endangering her life. Many would turn away but we don't say no. ICU, surgical and critical care teams worked through the night, drained the abscess and reversed the infection. She survived, regained strength and returned to her baby, proving that distance and complexity cannot stop determined

Committed to Research and Academics

At Dr. Hedgewar Hospital, our dedication to advancing medical science goes beyond patient care. Under the wing of Sushrut Archive, this year marked a milestone as we became one of only 16 centres in India selected to conduct a prestigious clinical trial for a critical disease. This achievement not only placed us on the national research map but also reaffirmed our belief that rural and semi-urban healthcare institutions can be at the forefront of scientific discovery. Building on this success, we have lined up a series of new trials and surveys that will address pressing health challenges, generate valuable data, and strengthen evidence-based treatment protocols. By integrating research with patient care, we continue to prove that commitment to science and compassion go hand in hand.

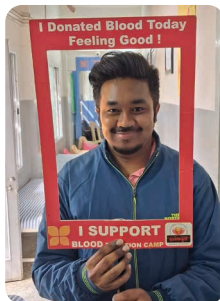

Intentions

The Niramay wellness series was initiated as a bridge between early discomfort and timely medical attention. Instead of waiting for patients to come forward, we created a space where hesitation gave way to open conversations especially around conditions like prostate enlargement, osteoporosis, and cardiac risk.

Urology, cardiac, and bone density camps were planned to uncover hidden symptoms. Target groups included middle-aged and elderly individuals who often delay screenings. Camps also served as a tribute and awareness effort, such as the one in memory of Dr. Dhavad.

Findings

Each camp surfaced health trends that typically remain buried under routine neglect. Participants shared long-ignored symptoms, often attributing them to age or stress—until screenings revealed otherwise.

Many participants showed early signs of chronic conditions they had never tested for.

Men admitted to avoiding discussions about urinary health until they saw real test results.

Several cases were referred immediately for follow-up diagnostics like angiography.

Discoveries

Beyond numbers, Niramay fostered a change in mindset. Seeing test results in black and white prompted action, but more importantly, it gave people language to speak about their health—something they'd lacked before.

Some individuals were able to avoid unnecessary interventions through early detection.

Others began small, preventive changes that could delay or halt disease progression.

The camps seeded a deeper community readiness for regular, preventive checkups.

What can one day of yoga really do? At Niramay, we believe the purpose of this day is not to promise instant change, but to plant intention. One session may not change your body, but it can shift your awareness. It can mark the beginning of a habit that brings strength, stillness, and clarity.

On the occasion of International Yoga Day, Niramay, in collaboration with Shree Jalaram Satsang Mandal, Amravati, hosted a community yoga session with active participation from all age groups.

The event was guided by experienced instructors who emphasized presence over performance. Participants engaged in simple postures, breathwork, and quiet reflection, many experiencing yoga in its truest form for the first time. Rather than dismissing the effort, we invite a shift in perspective. What if this one day becomes the day it all begins? Sometimes, all it takes is a start.

On Sunday, July 28, Dr. Hedgewar Hospital and Dr. Anjali Kavimandan Memorial Hospital came together to mark World Hepatitis Day with an inspiring Walkathon. Despite the rainy day, the support was extravagant, with people of all age groups participating with great enthusiasm. A total of 167 medals were distributed, reflecting the energy and commitment of the participants.

Healthy Sundays@DHH began with the plan to host three themed events every quarter: Cook Healthy, Care for Caregivers, and Mental Health. The idea was to create a vibrant calendar of community learning and connection.

Our journey started with enthusiasm but soon met the practical challenges of coordination, resources, and participation. We aimed for twelve Sundays but held fewer, most focused on mental health, a theme that resonated deeply. Each session, though fewer in number, became a space for genuine dialogue and healing.

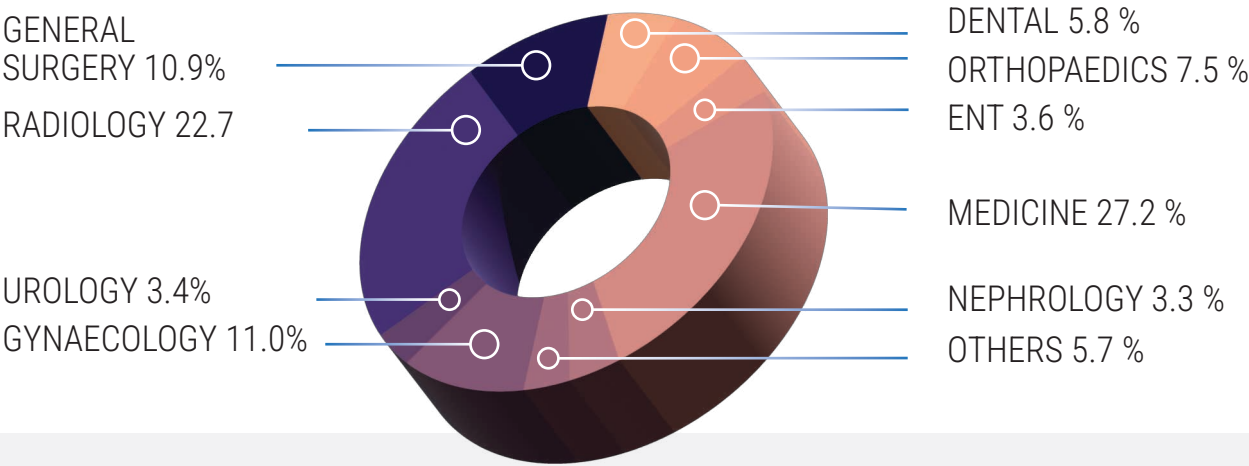
